

You Thought Chicken Meant Chicken?

Here's some definitions to help us begin to understand what goes into most pet foods.

Animal Digest: A material which results from chemical and/or enzymatic hydrolysis of clean and undecomposed animal tissue. Animal tissues used shall be exclusive of hair, horns, teeth, hooves, and feathers, except in such trace amounts as might occur unavoidably in good factory practice and shall be suitable for animal feed. Usually used as a pet food flavoring. It is a cooked-down broth made form unspecified parts of unspecified animals. Any kind of animal can be included: goats, pigs, horses, rats, etc. Animal can be obtained from any source, so there is no control over quality or contamination.

BHA/BHT: Butylated Hydroxyanisole and Butylated Hydroxytoluene, both of which are chemical preservatives. These chemicals have been banned from human use in many countries but are still permitted in pet foods in the U.S.

Chicken: Combination of flesh and skin and could include bone. Does not include feathers, heads, feet, or entrails. Does not have to be USDA inspected. Could consist of almost 100% chicken/poultry meat or it could consist of less than 1% meat, 99% skin and bone or it could be somewhere in between. The definition allows for any variation in pet food while still being labeled as chicken.

Chicken Meal: Chicken with moisture removed. Bottom line: Chicken can be a quality ingredient if it is sourced from a USDA inspected and approved bird and if it includes meat (not just skin and bones).

Chicken By-Products: Chicken by-products are parts of the chicken such as the heads, feet & viscera (internal organs) of the birds. Some pet food manufacturers make the claim this is a quality ingredient because it includes nutrient dense internal organs. Internal organs such as kidney, liver, or heart from healthy birds do provide quality nutrition to a pet food. However this ingredient is a catch-all ingredient (combination of internal organs, heads, feet, etc.) without giving the consumer any guarantee to quality of those internal organs. As example, the liver filters toxins from the body. Liver from a sick bird or a bird that was fed numerous drugs prior to slaughter could result in a dangerous liver for the pet to consume.

Chicken By-Product Meal: Chicken by-products with moisture removed.

Corn Gluten Meal: Dried residue from corn after the removal of the larger part of the starch and germ. It is an inexpensive by-product of human food processing. It is a carbohydrate that offers very little nutritional value. Serves mainly to bind pet food ingredients together. See Wheat Gluten for more.

Corn Meal: Entire corn kernel, finely ground.

Ethoxyquin: A chemical preservative not approved for human use.

Meat Byproducts: Leftovers from butchering any mammal. They can include almost any part of the animal other than meat. Because any mammal can be used, cheaper meats like horse, pig, or goat are often included. Pet foods that use meat by-products & meat meal are the resting place for many sick. unwanted or found dead animals in the U.S. Meat meal can contain condemned parts & animals that are rejected for human consumption. It can include pus, cancerous tissue. & decomposed (spoiled) tissue. Wheat Gluten: The tough, viscid nitrogenous substance remaining when wheat is washed to remove the starch. According to Mike Sagman from dogfoodadvisor.com, gluten is a protein imposter. "All things considered, the higher the protein content of a dog food, the greater its perceived value. But the amount of protein only tells half the story. It's a protein's digestibility and its biological value that matter more. And that's the problem. Protein can come from just about anywhere---even from non-nutritious sources like leather, hair, feathers, chicken beaks. Or that mysterious meat substitute—gluten. Here are the two most important things to know about gluten ingredients... 1) Glutens are less nutritionally complete than meat based proteins. They're low in some of the ten essential amino acids dogs need to sustain life. 2) Glutens can raise the protein reported on a food label. So, manufacturers frequently add them to a recipe to make a product look better than it really is. Bottom line: Whenever you see gluten on a dog food ingredients list, you should always question the true meat content of the product."

Flea & Tick Facts You May Not Know



Your pet doesn't have to go outside to get fleas.

"Fleas are fantastic hitchhikers," says Mark Stickney, DVM, clinical associate professor at Texas A&M College of Veterinary Medicine & Biomedical Sciences in College Station, TX. They can get a ride inside on people & visiting pets, sneak in through gaps in windows & doors & hide out in carpets or upholstery. So keeping your cat or dog indoors isn't enough to protect him from fleas.

Ticks don't jump or fall from trees; they climb.

These pests hide in wooded areas, brush piles, overgrown meadows & on grasses along trails' edges, waiting for a host (you or your pet) to pass by. Once a tick detects vibrations, odors, breath or shadows from a nearby host, it crawls quickly on board, looking for a spot to attach & feed on. Because they move too fast for you to see them, don't walk through tick-infested areas without long sleeves, pants &insect repellant.

You may not know your pet has fleas.

"Fleas spend only about 5% of their total lives on pets," says Dr. Stickney. The rest of the time, they may be hard-to-see eggs or larvae in pet bedding, carpets, upholstery & even between floor boards. If your pet is scratching & you haven't spotted adult fleas, run a flea comb through his coat. Black specks could be flea droppings, & if they turn red on a wet, white paper towel, fleas have been feeding on your pet. Check pet's



Some pets are allergic to fleas.

Both cats and dogs can develop flea allergy dermatitis (FAD) from flea bites. "It's the most common cause of itchy pets," says Dr. Little. Allergic pets constantly chew on their skin. Dogs typically have hair loss on their bellies, along their spine or near their tails. Constant scratching can lead to skin sores (easily hidden in long-haired pets) & bacterial infections, says Dr. Stickney.

Flea and tick products aren't foolproof.

In peak season, ticks can lay 7,000 eggs at once, while fleas can lay 40 to 50 per day. "Even if a product is 99% effective, chances are your pet will pick up at least one tick," says Dr. Little. So regularly inspect him from head to toe. Use a flea comb, and run your hands down your pet's body to feel for ticks, especially in between paw pads, in skin folds, in and around the ears and along his spine. Ticks range from the size of a poppy seed to an apple seed and will appear plump and bloated if they've fed.

Your pet needs year-round protection. Yes, you are at risk in the winter too.

Fleas and ticks are a year-round risk, no matter where you live. For example, the tick that transmits Lyme disease is most active October through March in the Northeast. Midwest, South Central and Southeastern US. "Ticks decrease activity in the cold, but they don't die," says Dr. Little. "I've seen ticks on grasses sticking out above the snow." As for fleas, your cozy home is the perfect place to thrive all year, while a warm spell in the middle of winter may allow flea eggs to hatch outdoors. "These pests have developed survival strategies," says Dr. Stickney. "Use parasite protection all year long so they never get a foothold."

What to do.

Try natural remedies first! There are many "spot on" treatments on the market that have serious side effects. Vacuuming the carpets and furniture will pick up eggs, this is especially important if your pets are allowed to sleep or climb on sofas, beds, etc. Cleaning the area where the pet's favourite sleeping place is will remove significant numbers of eggs and larvae. It is possible especially when the infestation is light, for do it yourself pest control to be effective. Odyssey Pets offers natural, safe remedies like Wondercide. PET FOOD CO-PACKING INDUSTRY'S BEST KEPT SECRET

Co- Packing is short for 'Contract Packaging/Packager'. This is where a 'Pet Food Company' (I think it's more appropriate to call these companies 'Marketing Companies'), contracts out the manufacture, and typically the ingredient sourcing of their pet food to a third party....called a co-packer. Co-packers run large mass production facilities that produce many different brands of cat and dog food each day. They produce it and put another company's name on the product. The 'Pet Food Company' provides the recipe and the bags, while the ingredient sourcing and manufacture of the product is left up to the co-packer. Do you have some pause when you learn this ...?

Why should I have pause?

Most Pet Food is co-packed. There are inherent possible problems that arise from this model of manufacturing. The obvious issue is the integrity proposition. The company that has their name on the bag does not have control over the ingredient sourcing or the production of their product. If you asked the Pet Food Company where a specific ingredient was sourced, they will have to check with the co-packer. The co-packer will have you provide the lot number and expiry date for tracking purposes because the ingredient source will change depending on when it was purchased. Their sourcing will fluctuate with market supply and availability. In fact, most co-packers don't even do the sourcing of the ingredients they use...they hire an agent to do this for them. It is true that a company can provide their own ingredients to a co-packer, or require the co-packer to buy particular ingredients for their recipe, however one of the big draws of using a co-packer is that a co-packer can buy in bulk because they produce so much pet food - more than any one pet food company can on its own. Buying in bulk makes the process cheaper, and the profits richer, it stands to reason that with many of the ingredients crossing multiple lines of pet food, those ingredients are going to be the same across the different brands being manufactured. This scenario of ingredient 'sharing' is also one of the reasons why when you see a recall, it tends to be followed by several other brands being recalled in a short time frame.

What Should I do?

There are a handful of manufacturers who choose not to co-pack and take great pride in their ingredient sourcing and finished product. Horizon Pet Nutrition is one of them. They don't co-pack they make their own food at their own plant in Rosthern Saskatchewan - in the heart of Canada's Agriculture Belt! Sourcing is a point of pride for Horizon. Quality and Safety First - Ingredients are all whole and unprocessed and bought from the same suppliers that the grocery stores buy from (*except chicken, turkey and salmon meals). Approximately 90% of all Horizon ingredients are sourced from within 60 miles of their plant! You won't find any foreign sourced ingredients in Horizon products. Another point of pride for the Horizon team is the high animal inclusion rates in all of the lines—66-81%. Horizon products use only named animal meats/meals and no by-products. Don't forget that animal products (meat and eggs) are among the highest cost item when putting together a recipe....so many manufactures skimp on how much animal they use because less animal means lower cost to produce, and higher profits. Horizon products however, are among the best priced in the market today. You get all of the above average attributes outlined for around the same price that you pay for a grocery store brand.
